H: 3 feet, June, Red Fruit late summer and fall. Needs a male for pollination.



*Solidago rugosa* 'Fireworks'  
H: 2.5 to 3 feet, September to October



*Iris sibirica* 'Caesar's Brother' (Siberian Iris)  
H: 3 to 4 feet, May, Interesting seed pods, excellent foliage with some color in late fall



*Aronia melanocarpa* (Black Chokeberry)  
H: 3 to 6 feet, May, Black fruit, fall color





*Cornus sericea* 'Arctic Fire' (Dwarf Red Osier Dogwood)

H: 3 to 4 feet, May, June, Red stems in winter



*Clethra alnifolia* 'Hummingbird' (Summersweet)

H: 2 to 4 feet, July, August, Fall color



*Diervilla lonicera* 'Copper' (Dwarf Bush honeysuckle)

H: 2 to 3 feet, June, suckers, new foliage colorful



*Callicarpa japonica* (Beautyberry)

H: 4 feet, June, Fruit late summer into fall, may die back to ground in winter
