



Acanthus spinosus (Bear's Breeches)
H: 3 – 4 feet, June to August



Ajuga reptans 'Burgundy Glow'
H: 3 – 8 inches, Late spring to early summer



Bergenia cordifolia (Pig Squeak)
H: 1 to 1.5, April, May



Brunnera variegata
H: 1 to 1.5 feet, April, May



Corydalis lutea
H: 1 to 1.5, May to September



Dicentra formosa (western Bleeding Heart)
H: 6 to 12 inches, late spring



Dryopteris erythrosora, (Autumn Fern)
H: 1.5 to 2.5 feet, peak color in spring



Echinacea pallida (Pale Purple Coneflower)
H: 2 to 3 feet, June, July



Epimedium X rubrum

H: 0.5 to 1 foot, small red flowers in April



Euphorbia polychroma (Cushion Spurge)

H: 1 to 1.5 feet, April, May



Geranium macrorrhizum (Big Root Geranium)

H: 0.75 to 1 foot, April to June



Helleborus

H: 1 to 1.5 feet, March to April



Heuchera villosa 'Autumn Bride'
H: 1.5 to 3 feet, August, September



Lamium
H: 6 to 8 inches, Spring and periodically in summer



Liriope muscari (Lily Turf)
H: 1 to 1.5 feet, August to September



Polygonatum biflorum (Smooth Solomon's Seal)
H: 1 to 3 feet, April, May



Polygonatum odoratum
 'Variegatum' (Variegated Solomon's Seal)
 H: 2 to 3 feet, April, May



Polystichum acrostichoides (Christmas Fern)
 H: 1 to 2 feet



Rohdea japonica (Sacred Lily)
 H: 1.5 to 2 feet, Bright berries in fall, Zone 6



Acanthopanax sieboldianus 'Variegatus'
 (Aralia)
 H: 6 to 8 feet, May, June (insignificant)



Diervilla 'Cool Splash'

H: 2 to 3 feet, June, July (insignificant)



Hypericum beanie (Saint John's Wort)

H: 2 to 3 feet, July – September, Zone 6



Rhus aromatica (Gro-Lo sumac)

H: 1.5 to 2 feet, April, May (insignificant), Late summer – catkins and berries, fall color



Viburnum acerifolium (Maple leaf viburnum)

H: 3 to 6 feet, June, black fruit – September, fall color

Susceptible to the viburnum leaf beetle
