hidden

H: 1.5 feet, July

H: 20 inches, July



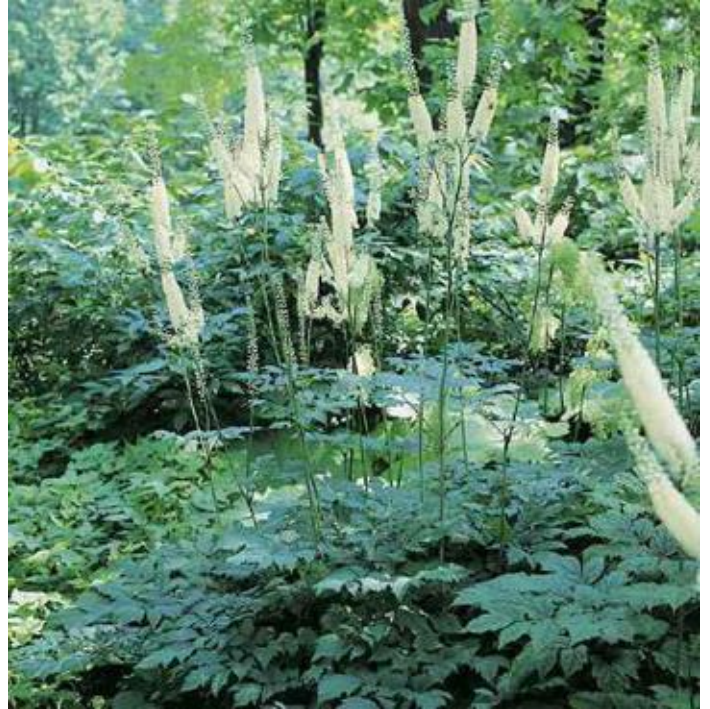
Astilbe 'Color Flash Lime'

H: 2 to 5 feet, August, September

H: 4 to 6 feet, June, July



Chelone glabra (Turtlehead)
H: 2 to 3 feet, July, August



Chelone obliqua (Rose Turtlehead)
H: 2 to 3 feet, August, September



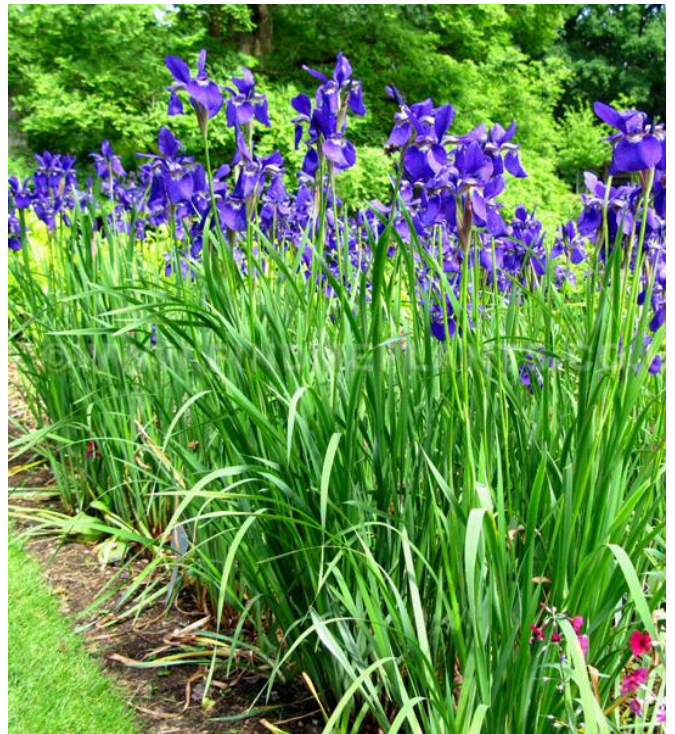
Chelone lyonii 'Hot Lips' (Pink Turtlehead)
H: 2 to 3 feet, Late July, August



Dicentra eximia (Fringed Bleeding Heart)
H: 1 to 1.5 feet, June, July



Hakonechloa macra (Japanese Forest Grass)
H: 1 to 1.5 feet, July, August



Iris siberica 'Caesar's Brother' (Siberian Iris)
H: 3 to 4 feet, May, Interesting seed pods, excellent foliage with some color in late fall



Lobelia cardinalis (Cardinal Flower)
H: 2 to 4 feet, August-September



Lobelia 'Monet Moment' (Cardinal Flower)
H: 2 to 3 feet, August



Lobelia 'Fan Blue'
H: 2 feet, August



Lobelia siphilitica (Great Blue Lobelia)
H: 2 to 3 feet, August, september



Matteuccia struthiopteris (Ostrich Fern)
H: 3 to 6 feet



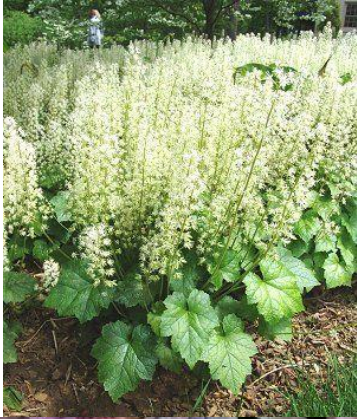
Petasites japonicus (Butterbur)
H: 2 to 3 feet, Early spring, can be aggressive



Petasites japonicus var. *giganteus* 'Nishiki-buki'
H: 2 to 3 feet, Early spring, May revert



Senecio aureus (Golden Ragwort)
H: 0.5 to 2 feet, Spring



Tiarella cordifolia 'Brandywine' (Foam Flower)
H: 0.75 to 1 foot, Spring



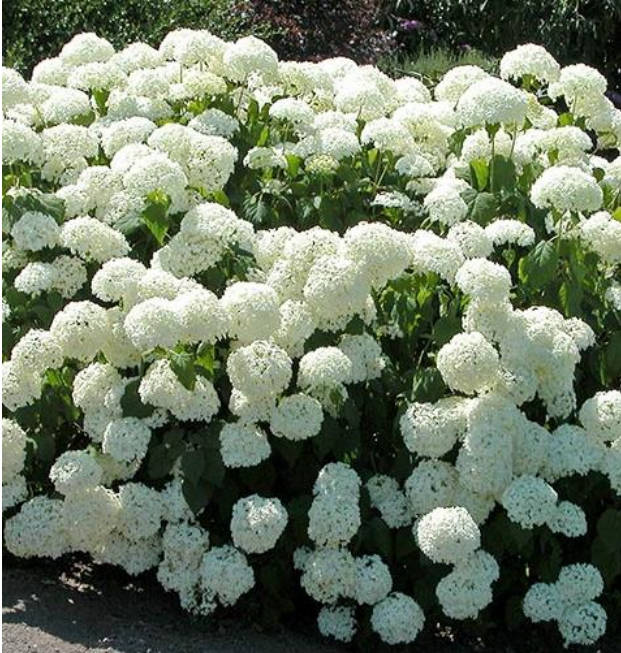
Aralia cordata 'Sun King' (Spikenard)
H: 3 to 4 feet, August, September, small
purple berries



Clethra alnifolia 'Hummingbird'
H: 2 to 4 feet, July, August, Fall color



Cornus sericea 'Baileyi' (Red Osier Dogwood)
H: 6 to 10, May, June, Red stems in winter



Hydrangea arborescens 'Annabelle'
H: 3 to 5 feet, July to September, Dried
flowers provide winter interest



Hydrangea 'Endless Summer'
H: 2 to 4 feet, July to September



Ilex glabra 'Compacta' (Inkberry)
H: 3 to 6 feet, Evergreen, Can be used as
boxwood substitute, purple fruit, needs male
for pollination



Itea virginica 'Little Henry' 'Virginia
Sweetspire'
H; 2 to 3 feet, June, July, Excellent fall color
